T-Ball Rules Ages 5-6

- **1.** T-Ball games will be (4) innings or one (1) hour in duration. No new inning may begin after the 1 hour time limit.
- **2.** Each player must play at least two (2) innings per game.
- **3.** The minimum number of players to start and continue a game is nine (9) players.
- **4.** All batters must come to bat in their half of the inning.
- **5.** When the last batter bats and an out occurs at any base, the inning is over.
- **6.** Players are not permitted to "play off" or "steal" a base.
- 7. The "Infield Fly Rule" is not in effect.
- **8.** The pitcher shall not leave the pitcher's circle until the ball is batted.
- **9.** A batter may not swing until ball is place on tee.
- 10. A batter has three (3) chances to hit the ball into fair territory. If he/she does not succeed he/she is declared out.(Coaches Discretion)
- 11. Once a player has the ball in his/her possession in the INFIELD, he/she may call "time". At this point all the base runners must stay at the base they are on. If in the umpire's judgment, a player is halfway down the base line, he/she may advance to the next base. A play may be made on the runner if he/she tries to advance.
- **12.** A batter is declared out if he/she slings the bat.
- 13. The volunteers will keep score during the game; however, no official scores or standings will be kept in the T-Ball league.
- **14.** NO PROTESTS WILL BE ALLOWED!
- 15. Each team will bat through their lineup, but once the defense has made 3 outs, the bases will be cleared and batting team will continue to bat until they have reached the end of their batting order.
- 16. Each position on the field, including outfielder positions should be filled by a player. Players should remain in their respective positions during the games and the fundamentals of the positions on the field should be stressed by coaches during practice.
